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
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



History

This year marks the 50th year of new play production at The Open Eye Theater. We were founded in New York City as Theater of the Open Eye in 1972, by the late famed dancer-choreographer Jean Erdman and her husband, the renowned mythologist Joseph Campbell. Renamed

The Open Eye Theater, we relocated to the Catskill Mountains in 1994, where, under the leadership of producing artistic director Amie Brockway, we performed in eighteen villages and hamlets before creating a permanent home for theater in Margaretville NY, in 2006.



PATRICIA BRANNEN (Babs in SCARS and Woman in THE GREATEST CARD TRICK) is a retired case manager for the Delaware County Office for the Aging. She has participated in various ways at The Open Eye Theater, including light board operator twice (thank God for Erwin) and stage manager for eight productions. She was keyboard player for the Christmas productions in 2011, 2013, 2014 and 2015. She is the organist at the Andes United Methodist Church. Her first acting role at The Open Eye Theater was Tilly Slowboy in THE CRICKET ON THE HEARTH. She went on to be Ouiser Boudreaux in STEEL MAGNOLIAS, and since has been in fourteen roles in the SHORTCUT productions. Her last role was Mrs. Soames in OUR TOWN.

AMIE BROCKWAY (Producing Artistic Director of The Open Eye Theater, Director for THE GREATEST CARD TRICK AND CANYON'S EDGE, Gina in MORE PASTA) is the proud recipient of the Sara Spencer 2015 Award of Artistic Achievement from the American Alliance for Theatre and Education (AATE), and winner of the 2006 Children's Theater Foundation Aurand Harris Grant, and Artistic Visionary Award from The Working Theater. She was a nominee for the Orlin Corey Award for Artistic Excellence in 2020. Her directing credits at The Open Eye include OUR TOWN, AMBER WAVES, SENECA FALLS. THE MIRACULOUS JOURNEY OF EDWARD TULANE, ONE NIGHT WITH FANNY BRICE, IRVING BERLIN'S AMERICA, WALKING TOWARD AMERICA, ROMEO & JULIET. THE TEMPEST, A WOMAN CALLED TRUTH and numerous other productions of full-length and ten-minute plays, American and world classics, and musicals. Her own plays THE ODYSSEY, and THE NIGHTINGALE are published by Dramatic Publishing Company. She has directed new works and participated in new play development projects at the Bonderman National Youth Theater Playwriting Symposium, New Visions/New Voices at The Kennedy Center, Write Now in Tempe AZ and Indianapolis IN, the Coterie in Kansas City. and ALAP (Alliance of Los Angeles Playwrights). She has performed in Open Eve productions of MIDSUMMER MADNESS, KEEPING MR. LINCOLN, ANCESTRAL VOICES, A YEAR DOWN YONDER, A CHRISTMAS CAROL, among others. She is co-host of The Open Eve Theater Playtime on WIOX Radio in the Catskills 91.3 FM. She is a member of SAG/AFTRA, The Dramatists Guild, Stage Directors and Choreographers Society, and is a past co-president of the League of Professional Theater Women.

RON BROCKWAY (Lester in THE BACK-PORCH GANG) is new to The Open Eye Theater. While not a stranger to theater, this is his first acting role in many years. Ron has worked in several theater groups in New Jersey previously as designer, and as technical director. While in New Jersey, Ron was Installation Coordinator for McCarter Theater's concert series on the Princeton University campus, and designed stage productions at the University's Theater Intime. He also spent ten years at New Jersey Public Television as studio carpenter and in remote installation. In Florida, Ron's experience led him to the Vero Beach Museum of Art. His role as Director of Operations included designing for and overseeing the installation of many types of art.

ENID COKINOS (Playwright for WEAVING A TAPESTRY) is excited to include WEAVING A TAPESTRY in The Open Eye Theater's Summer Shortcuts XII. Based on a story of maternal pragmatism shared by her dear friend Norma, TAPESTRY is, in part, based on a peculiar real-life fabric discovery, but also a search for deeper understanding in the strangest of places. Above all, it is a testament to open yourself up to whatever counsel life might offer. Since discovering playwriting in 2014. Enid's plays have been performed in Indiana. New York. California, New Jersey, Connecticut, Florida, and Kansas. In addition to writing plays, her short fiction and non-fiction pieces appear in various online journals including Flying Island Literary Journal, Medium (formerly 1:1000), and Story Circle Network's Anthologies. CAN'T LIVE WITHOUT YOU was his first play to receive an off-off Broadway production in January 2008 and was produced by The Playgroup for their 2018-2019 season at The Willow Theatre in Boca Raton, Florida.
